CAPS Committee - Daisy Zhang

An end-of-school-year picnic was planned but it may be canceled or postponed until the end of summer depending on how the school year ends.

IASPA Committee - Gopi Suri

Had to cancel plans to hold a March/April Holi celebration event. Will look forward to do one in 2021.

<u>Latin American Council (LAC) Committee</u> - Liset Rajaratnam

Liset created a WhatsApp group for Mt. Hebron's Spanish-speaking families, and is calling each of the school's 240 families individually to invite them to join the group. The school currently uses Remind to communicate with Spanish-speaking students, and texting to communicate with parents, and we are coordinating with related school staff and admin. PTSA will use WhatsApp as an additional tool to communicate with families, including providing links to information about the current Technology Survey, and online education opportunities and school classes.

After-Prom - Caroline Bodziak & Laura Munns

The status of Prom/After-Prom is in limbo as HCPSS has not yet updated the date when school is expected to officially begin again back in the building after the President's call to extend the Social Distancing directive to April 30. PTSA has decided to cancel existing contracts with the intention of re-evaluating and re-initiating if Prom is rescheduled.

A successful AP is contingent upon being able to rework all PTSA contracts with the site (YMCA) and vendors (entertainment, food, bus, security), and having enough time to recruit volunteers, communicate/market effectively to students & parents, and sell tickets.

PTSA and Viking Backers have a signed MOU representing the intention of VB to donate to After-Prom in lieu of PTSA pursuing corporate donations. The 2020 donation is \$7,000. If AP is cancelled, PTSA will return the funds to VB, and determine a new amount for 2021.

The Sign-up Genius has been updated. Tuxedo rental measurements had to be cancelled. Parent donation letters were to go out by April 1 but have been cancelled - half the order is still at HCPSS Print Shop.

In the event AP is cancelled, PTSA will find a way to raffle off prizes we already have to Hebron's current juniors and seniors.
